Professor Simon K. Donaldson (UK)

President of the institute of Mathematical Sciences, and Professor of Mathematics at imperial College, London

Professor Mudumbai S. Narasimhan (India)

Honorary Fellow, Tata institute of Fundamental Research in India

for their seminal contributions to theories which have strengthened the links between mathematics and physics, and helped provide a rigorous foundation for physical theories giving a very' good description of the laws of matter at the sub-nuclear level. This has helped establish strong ties with the formulation of quantum chromo-dynamics for which the King Faisal Prize was given last year (in physics).
